Course Info:

The purpose of the qualification is to provide the skills, knowledge and understanding required to provide medical oxygen to a patient in line with guidelines and protocols. The qualification covers how and when to administer oxygen and the safety concerns which need to be considered regarding the carrying, storage and administration of oxygen.

**Entry requirements:**

The qualification is available to learners aged 16 or over. Due to the practical nature of the assessment there are physical demands and learners must be able to demonstrate their skills as in a real-life situation. An example of this would be to demonstrate CPR on a manikin at floor level. It is recommended that learners should hold a minimum of Level 1 in literacy or equivalent to undertake this qualification. It may be possible to allocate a reasonable adjustment to a learner who has a disability, medical condition or learning need; learners should contact their training provider to discuss. Any reasonable adjustments granted must be in line with the FAA Reasonable Adjustments Policy.

Duration:

A minimum of six hours makes up this unit consisting of theoretical and practical work, plus some pre-course activity could be required.

Syllabus:

A range of subjects is covered including:-

- Know guidelines for the use of oxygen therapy
- Be able to administer oxygen therapy

**Certification:**

The qualification is valid for three years from the date of achievement. It is recommended that the learner attends annual refresher training. The learner will need to complete the full course again to requalify for a further three years.

Numbers:

A maximum of 12 students can be accommodated on this course.

Age limit:

Students must be a minimum of 16 years of age to qualify.
